Report of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee for a Framework Convention on Climate Change: recommendations to the Conference of the Parties and other decisions and conclusions requiring action by the Conference of the Parties: Matters relating to commitments [5 (a)]

(iv) Criteria for joint implementation

The Committee decided to establish a working group to carry out informal open-ended consultations on joint implementation.

Provision to developing country Parties of technical and financial support [5 (c)]

The representative of the Republic of Korea (speaking on behalf of the Group of 77 and China) introduced a draft decision on technology transfer.

A statement was made by the representative of France (on behalf of the European Union).

Statements were made by the representatives of the United States of America, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, China, Australia, New Zealand and the Netherlands.

The Committee then recommended the draft decision, as orally amended, for adoption by the Conference of the Parties.

Designation of a permanent secretariat and arrangements for its functioning: [5 (d)]

- (iv) Adoption of the Convention budget for the biennium 1996-1997
- (v) Extrabudgetary funding for the interim secretariat in 1995

Action on documents FCCC/CP/1995/L.4, L.7 and L.8

The representative of Mauritania (chairman of the consultations on the two sub-items) introduced three draft decisions entitled "Designation of a permanent secretariat and arrangements for its functioning: Adoption of the convention budget for the biennium 1996-1997" (FCCC/CP/1995/L/4), "Other voluntary funding for the bieinnium 1996-1997" (FCCC/CP/1995/L.8) and "Extrabudgetary funding for the interim secretariat for 1995" (FCCC/CP/1995/L.7).

Statements were made by France (on behalf of the European Union), the United States and Australia.

The Executive Secretary responded to questions raised.

The Committee then recommended the draft decisions contained in documents FCCC/CP/1995/L.4 and L.8, as orally amended, and the draft decision contained in FCCC/CP/1995/L.7 for adoption by the Conference of Parties.

(iii) Physical location

The Chairman made a statement on the question of the location of the permanent secretariat.

Statements were made by the representatives of Canada, Switzerland, Italy, Poland, Germany, Nigeria, Costa Rica, Ethiopia, Mali, Trinidad and Tobago, Burkina Faso, the United States, Mauritius and Uruguay.

Statements were also made by the observers for Iran (Islamic Republic of), Togo, Cape Verde, Niger and Djibouti.
