#### PRESIDENTIAL CEREMONY AND HIGH-LEVEL SEGMENT OF COP 4

#### **Presidential Ceremony**

A Presidential Ceremony will be held on Wednesday, 11 November, at 10:00 in Plenary I. H.E. Mr. Carlos Saul Menem, President of the Republic of Argentina, will speak at the ceremony. The Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations will also deliver a statement.

#### Access to the premises

The main entrance to the building will be closed as of 9:30. Delegates arriving after that time are requested to use the press entrance located on the left side of the building.

#### Access to Plenary I

It is expected that a large number of participants as well as members of the press and other media will attend. There will be restrictions on movements around the main entrance to Plenary I for security reasons. After 9:30 access to Plenary I will be by the side doors only. As the President of the Conference wishes the meeting to start promptly, delegates are kindly requested to take their seats by 9:30.

#### Seating arrangements

In view of the large number of participants registered, the number of places is limited to four for each delegation and two for Observer States, United Nations bodies, specialized agencies, related organizations and intergovernmental organizations. To ensure representative attendance by non-governmental organizations and the print media and news agencies, a limited number of special tickets has been distributed to the various NGO constituencies and to the media. Representatives of NGOs and the media will have access to the meeting room upon presentation of their badges and the special tickets.

The proceedings will also be shown on the screen in Plenary II and on CCTV monitors throughout the meeting premises.

## **COP 4 Plenary**

Following the Presidential Ceremony, the Conference plenary will reconvene to hear addresses by representatives of United Nations specialized agencies and programmes as well as other intergovernmental organizations.

### Registration

Registration of delegations for the fourth session of the Conference of the Parties will take place at the main entrance of the conference premises until Friday, 13 November 1998 between 7:30 and 17:00

## Credentials

Credentials of representatives, alternate representatives and advisers shall be issued either by the Head of State or Government or by the Minister for Foreign Affairs. Delegations are kindly requested to forward the corresponding letter of credentials to the secretariat (Mr. Horacio Peluffo, room 33).

## **Funding for delegates**

Delegates from Parties eligible for funding are requested to contact the secretariat in room 26 upon their arrival, from 9:00 to 13:00 and from 14:00 to 17:00. Information will be provided by the secretariat on how to collect the daily subsistence allowance.

#### Reminder to all funded delegates:

payment of installments will be made beginning on Wednesday, 11 November through to Friday, 13 November 1998 between the hours of 9:00 -17:00 in room number 26 (Administration).

Please be sure to bring your passport and/or identification with you.

#### **Documents distribution counter**

## **Media arrangements**

The media centre offers facilities for television, radio, print media and news agencies. They include an international broadcasting centre providing live video and audio coverage of proceedings in the plenaries, and the press conference room, an open press working area for the print media with a communications centre as well as other media information facilities and services, and a press conference room.

Requests by government delegations and intergovernmental organizations to <u>book the</u> <u>press conference room</u>, located at the press entrance, should be addressed to Michael Williams, Conference Spokesman. Briefings will normally be limited to 30 minutes maximum and the schedule will be posted on the programme monitors. The press information and documents counter at the press entrance will assist journalists in contacting delegates to arrange interviews.

## **UNFCCC Who-is-Who and CD-ROM**

The UNFCCC Process in 1997 CD-ROM and the Who-is-Who in the UNFCCC Process 1996-1997 (Directory of Participants at Meetings of the Convention Bodies, July 1996 - December 1997) will be available at the Information Desk from 10:00 a.m. onwards.

## **Portable headsets**

Delegates are requested not to remove portable headsets from meeting rooms. When not in use, the headsets should be turned off in order to conserve the batteries.

## Parking

Each delegation is entitled to two parking permits. Embassies/delegations are requested to send someone with the necessary authorization to contact the United Nations security officer and collect the stickers on the day of the accreditation or thereafter. All cars will be allowed to drive to the entrance to drop passengers. Only cars bearing these stickers will be allowed to park in the reserved parking area outside the conference premises.

## Transportation
