I. OPENING OF THE SESSION

(Agenda item 1)

1. The seventeenth session of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) was held at the Vigyan Bhawan conference centre, New Delhi, India, from 23 to 29 October 2002.

2. The Chair of the SBSTA, Mr. Halldor Thorgeirsson (Iceland) opened the session and welcomed all Parties and observers. He noted that the provisional agenda of the session included progress reports on numerous intersessional and pre-sessional activities undertaken since the sixteenth session of the SBSTA.

3. He informed the SBSTA that Mr. Philip Weech (Bahamas), Vice-Chair of the SBSTA, had resigned from that post. He suggested that election of a replacement should await the election of the new SBSTA officers as no information on a possible replacement had been received from the Group of Latin American and Caribbean States. Following this, he welcomed Ms. Tatyana Ososkova (Uzbekistan) as Rapporteur of the SBSTA.

II. ORGANIZATIONAL MATTERS

(Agenda item 2)

A. Adoption of the agenda

(Agenda item 2 (a))

4. At its 1st meeting, on 23 October, the SBSTA considered a note by the Executive Secretary containing the provisional agenda and annotations (FCCC/SBSTA/2002/7). At the same meeting, the SBSTA adopted the agenda, the title of sub-item 4 (f) being amended to read, "Scientific and methodological aspects of the proposal by Brazil".

B. Organization of the work of the session

(Agenda item 2 (b))

5. The SBSTA considered this sub-item at its 1st meeting, on 23 October. At the same meeting, Parties were informed of the status of documentation and the suggested schedule of work. The Chair noted that provision had been made in the agenda for the SBSTA to take up any items referred to it by the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI). He also noted that the SBI had made a similar provision to take up any item referred to it by the SBSTA.

C. Election of officers other than the Chair

6. The SBSTA considered this sub-item at its 1st meeting, on 23 October. At the same meeting, the Chair drew the attention of Parties to rule 27 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, whereby the SBSTA is expected to elect its Vice-Chair and Rapporteur. The Chair noted that he would hold consultations with the coordinators of the regional groups to receive nominations for both positions, in close cooperation with the Chair of the SBI. Due to time constraints, these consultations would be held in conjunction with those for the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties (COP).

III. THIRD ASSESSMENT REPORT OF THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL PANEL ON CLIMATE CHANGE

(Agenda item 3)
